

Working with Scotland's business community to raise awareness and capacity to compete for the many opportunities generated by major events in Scotland, in the run up to the Glasgow 2014 Games and beyond.

Using the Games and other major events to showcase Scotland's goods and services, and to build strong relationships with international markets. Improving Scotland's reputation as an excellent place to do business.

2014 Food and Drink

Offering a range of activity capitalising on the year of 2014 to showcase Scotland's outstanding produce to the world.

Legacy 2014 Scotland's Best programme

An employability programme combining volunteering opportunities and accredited training for 16-24 year olds who have found it difficult to get into work. Many of the volunteering opportunities tap into sporting and cultural events that Scotland is hosting between 2013 and 2015.

Legacy 2014 Employer Recruitment Incentive

Supporting over 1,500 Employer Recruitment Incentive (ERI) payments to employers. Delivered by Skills Development Scotland, the £1,500 ERI payments help employers take on a 16-19 year old in a sports or events-related modern apprenticeship.

Outcome

Support Scottish businesses to tender successfully for Games contracts and increase their capacity to compete successfully in domestic and international markets.

Use the Games as a platform to help accelerate the internationalisation and growth of Scottish businesses.

Maximise the opportunities and benefits for Scotland's food sector, and boosting the country's reputation as a Land of Food and Drink.

Enable up to 1,000 young people to find volunteering opportunities in sports and cultural events. Increasing their general employability and opening up further employment or training opportunities.

Glasgow 2014 Employment

Through the Glasgow 2014 Games, thousands of employment and training opportunities were offered through the Glasgow 2014 Organising Committee, Games Sponsors, Games suppliers and service providers.

Legacy 2014 ScotGap

Provided security training and licences for Further and Higher Education students across Scotland. Helped thousands of students gain access to the security jobs required to deliver the Glasgow 2014 Games.

Host Broadcaster Training Initiative

Provided hands-on training in live broadcast, creative production and technology skills to up to 600 students across Scotland, and gave up to 200 Games-time experience.

BP Young Leaders programme

Supporting 65 disadvantaged young people over 18 months through a number of projects in their local communities, serving as a springboard to employment, education or training.

Volunteering 2014

12,500 Clyde-siders were recruited and trained by the Glasgow 2014 Organising Committee and helped ensure the 2014 Games were the best games ever.

Encouraging all 50,000 volunteer applicants to use their enthusiasm to consider wider volunteering opportunities.

Outcome

Help more people into employment having gained vital experience in delivering a major event in Scotland.

Thousands of students across Scotland successfully achieved industry recognised door supervisor and stewarding qualifications, allowing them to work within the security sector going forward.

Up to 600 students across Scotland given meaningful hands on training in live sport and outside broadcast production.

65 disadvantaged young people from Aberdeen, Edinburgh, the Shetland Islands and Glasgow will obtain recognised qualifications.

Help to develop an experienced and skilled volunteering workforce with access to local and national opportunities, and increased movement into employment, training and volunteering.

Game On Scotland

The official education programme for the Glasgow 2014 Games, Game On Scotland provides a platform to inspire and engage young people in Scotland and beyond. It is designed to enable educators to use the Glasgow 2014 Games as an inspiring, motivating, relevant and fun context for learning across the curriculum and for all ages.

Glasgow 2014 Cultural Programme

A nationwide celebration that played a central role in how Scotland hosted and welcomed the Games. Culture 2014 delivered events Scotland-wide as part of a yearlong cultural countdown to the Games, while Festival 2014 transformed the host city between 19 July and 3 August.

Celebrate

Lottery grants of up to £10,000 helped sports, arts, community and heritage organisations mark the arrival of the Games by holding an array of community-focussed events, including those with a cultural focus to celebrate the people, places and culture of the Commonwealth.

Get Scotland Dancing

A celebration of dance bringing together professional and amateur dancers of all ages to perform in public spaces in our towns, villages and cities across the country.

Outcome

Help encourage and celebrate an understanding of Scotland, and of other countries' cultures.

Support practitioners to develop inspiring learning experiences across the curriculum and engage in exclusive opportunities using the Commonwealth Games as a rich and diverse context.

Connect people and communities to the Games, celebrate sport and culture in new and surprising ways. Engage a global audience, making new connections through celebrating the culture and diversity of the Commonwealth.

Enable communities across Scotland to do something to mark the Games being in Scotland and to celebrate the people, places and culture of the Commonwealth.

The refurbished or newly developed venues and Village have left well-designed and sustainable state-of-the-art facilities for the local community and sport to use and enjoy well beyond the Glasgow 2014 Games.

Clyde Gateway activity

Clyde Gateway URC are delivering an ambitious regeneration programme, remediating land, creating state-of-the-art office and industrial space, attracting inward investment and local jobs and training opportunities.

Transport improvements

Around £1 billion of Games-related road and rail transport infrastructure projects were completed in time for the 2014 Games.

Street Soccer Scotland

Using sport as a catalyst for change, Street Soccer Scotland deliver a range of football-related programmes and personal development services to socially disadvantaged adults and young people.

SPFL Supporting Scotland's Communities

Funding towards the Scottish Communities League Cup is helping SPFL football clubs increase opportunities for physical, wellbeing and employability activity through clubs' existing community programmes.

ASPIRE Dundee

An arts education programme bringing together professional artists and schools to provide opportunities for 2,000 pupils to engage with a range of arts opportunities for disadvantaged young people in Dundee.

Outcome

The high-quality facilities and accommodation built for the Games help raise Glasgow's and Scotland's profile, and provide a great legacy for communities of Glasgow, particularly the East End.

Use the Games as a catalyst to drive forward the physical, social and economic regeneration programme currently transforming the East End of Glasgow and South Lanarkshire.

Help reduce journey times and open up new economic development opportunities, boosting the physical and social environment of Glasgow and West Central Scotland.

Help change people's lives for the better through the power of sport.

Help SPFL football clubs extend their reach into their local areas and work with partners to improve the health and wellbeing of Scotland's communities.

Legacy 2014 Pilotlight

A mentoring programme that matches senior business people from legacy partner agencies with the directors of small and medium-sized charities and social enterprises, in order to coach them through the process of building a more sustainable and effective organisation.

SCDC Games Legacy Community Programme

Delivered by the Scottish Community Development Centre, to provide nine community organisations and agencies with a platform to define what they wanted as an outcome from the Commonwealth Games and how they could work together to get involved to it.

Scottish Sport Relief Home and Away Programme

A joint initiative with Sport Relief supporting some of the most disadvantaged people in Scotland and some of the Commonwealth's poorest countries. Phase 1 of the home element supports young people, older people and women with mental health problems or who suffer neglect or abuse. The away element is helping groups and communities in three African countries.

SFA and Malawi FA

A coaching and education programme developed by the Scottish Football Association (SFA) and delivered in partnership with the Malawi Football Association. The programme saw the highly successful 'SFA School of Football' project piloted with a school in Malawi and the provision of critical resources and equipment to deliver quality coaching for the future.

Outcome

The 12 mentored charities/social enterprise will be more sustainable and better able to develop and deliver enhanced services to the communities and groups they support.

Community organisations empowered to use the Games as a catalyst to develop activities and projects that involve local people, increase local community action and support the achievement of better health and social outcomes.

Help strengthen and empower disadvantaged groups and communities in Scotland and the Commonwealth.

Increased participation and development of infrastructure for football in Malawi.

Delivered an intensive 1-3 month long programme of activities for Commonwealth students interested in learning more about climate change measures from Scottish universities.

Sustainable event management

The Glasgow 2014 Organising Committee developed environmental management plans for their venues, implementing initiatives to minimise and recycle waste. This work was to ensure sustainability was embedded within the procurement process and sustainable transport plans, providing a template for future Games and other major events.

Keep Scotland Beautiful

A range of interlinked activities on the theme of local environmental quality.

Stalled Spaces

Following the success of Glasgow City Council's Stalled Spaces project, Architecture and Design Scotland (A+DS) are delivering a national roll-out of the programme working with other Local Authorities across Scotland.

Outcome

Communicate and demonstrate the innovative ideas and thinking behind the Games, and map out the scale of physical and social change.

Enhanced knowledge and skills in climate change and environmental issues in participating Commonwealth nations and territories.

Capture the environmental story of the Games to transfer knowledge and best practices to local government and with future Host Cities.

Improving local environmental quality, increasing stewardship and respect for our physical environment and establishing sustainable networks and behaviours which support long-term change.

The programme aims to support and empower community groups to bring vacant and derelict spaces back into positive use for the benefit of the whole community. A + DS are supporting up to 30 stalled sites through the programme.
